Situated within the world-renowned community of Hilton Head Island / Bluffton on the East Coast of South Carolina, the intimate campus setting of IJGA provides student-athletes with easy access to state-of-the-art indoor and outdoor training facilities, top-quality instruction led by a world-class coaching team, and in partnership with quality schools who support student-athletes in their pursuit to achieve personal, collegiate and professional goals. Tutoring sessions, ESL classes, character & leadership program, mental training, strength & conditioning training, college planning + placement – round out the whole person, providing today's student-athletes with the resources, tools and peer group to be successful, not only in golf, but in life.









The Old Carolina campus boasts an indoor state-of-the-art **Performance Training Center, The Barn,** which houses the Swing Catalyst 3D Motion Plate & Studio, indoor hitting bays and short game area, simulators and cutting-edge technology. In addition to the enlarged Pinecrest Golf Club range, now with 90,000 sq. ft. of tees and multiple putting and chipping greens, we also have a Challenge Course, Himalayas and putting green, all of which are unsurpassed by any junior golf academy in the world.

Additional on-site amenities that support the modern-day golfer are the Strength and Conditioning Gym, FUEL dining hall and Learning Center. Although we have a number of homes in the Old Carolina campus, our priority over the next year or two is to have all students living on campus.

IJGA has produced many great junior golfers, with students going on to Yale, Oklahoma State, Duke and other prestigious colleges with great programs. But they also join the professional ranks, with three of sixty women at the The Olympics Games, three women major champions and men competing at The Masters. Founded over twenty years ago, IJGA is the longest established independent junior golf academy.

Peer Group

The study also found that students are more likely to earn an advanced degree and achieve faster career advancement.




THE BARN AT OLD CAROLINA CAMPUS



Improvement is in the DNA. If it's good for students, it's explored and embraced.



Jonathan Yarwood, a British PGA Master Professional, has a long-standing career that speaks for itself. He has trained a U.S. Open winner, two U.S. Amateur winners, two U.S. Girls' Winners, three AJGA Players of the Year, four #1 juniors, a collegiate #1 and winners on the PGA, LPGA, European, Challenge, Asian and Australasia tours. He has been recognized for his contribution to the game by being the youngest person to be made a British PGA Master Professional, in 2011. He was also voted a 'Top 20 Teacher under 40' by Golf Digest as well as voted in the 'Best Teachers in State Rankings' for over a decade. He has trained student-athletes of 11 years of age until they ultimately reached the tour. He is proud to be a part of the world-class team at IJGA and to bring his experience to a new generation of junior players.





Daniel Jackson, Assistant Director of Golf

Daniel started playing golf at age seven and then turned professional within golf when he was 20 after having a good amateur career. He began teaching county junior golf within the Nottinghamshire County in England. He had the privilege of working with Master Professionals and National Team coaches in the early stages of his coaching career. In 2008 he went on to work for David Leadbetter at Leadbetter's Academy in Austria and his junior academy in Florida. From there, Daniel went on to work with multiple international teams, various tour players and elite collegiate players. He is fully versed in the latest technology, such as: TrackMan, K-Vest, Bodi-Trak, SAM PuttLab and Swing Catalyst.

Daniel is a member of the English PGA, and is constantly developing through the implementation of the latest in scientific research that supports player development. Lastly, he is currently completing his MSc in Sports Coaching at The University of Birmingham (UK), which is a Top 75 University in the World.

GOLF DEVELOPMENT



IJGA is under the direction of Director of Golf Jonathan Yarwood, a British Master PGA Professional with 25 years of experience and a proven history. Yarwood has coached a U.S. Open winner, two U.S. Amateur winners, two U.S. Girls winners, 3 AJGA Players of the Year, 4 #1 juniors, a male and female #1, a collegiate #1 and winners on six tours.

- IJGA has an excellent team of golf coaches with an unparalleled average experience in junior golf teaching, learning and coaching.
- With a focus on cutting edge technologies, IJGA provides a fact based blueprint and accelerate improvement.
- Structured in POD teams with three PODS in total, each has its own coach. Small student-to-coach ratios allow for highly individualized training programs, specifically tailored to each student's needs.
- IJGA raises the player's profile for college with an emphasis on the strategic selection of tournaments for a competitive experience.
- IJGA encourages in-house competition to develop enjoyment and confidence in competition, with easy access to weekend golf.

Philosophy

We partner with aspiring golfers to create the pathways to being the best they can be using tried and tested methods. We aim to create a person of sound character who is academically strong as well as a robust and capable golfer.

Mental Performance

The glue that binds the whole thing together is the mental approach. Our program has four levels. One, a curriculum, classroom-based course. This forms the basis of the on-tee mental training, which in turn leads to tournament mental training at our competitive events. Character is just as important to us as the golfer, so we have a character program which looks at giving-back and the enrichment of the lives of others.

Strength & Conditioning Physical screening is a vital starting point for the physical fitness program. Golf is a sport that requires strength, mobility, stability and range of motion. The screening process highlights limitations in any of these areas, allowing the coach to generate a personalized program focusing not on gym-vanity but on creating a fully functioning, mobile and strong golf athlete.

> **Tournament Strategy** Tournaments provide the competitive environment to test students' skills. However, it is important to build the right schedule based on age, ability, goals and objectives. Having a mix of tournaments that provide different levels of difficulty is an excellent way to gain experience, be challenged and to build confidence. IJGT, Hurricane Junior Golf Tour and AJGA are the tours that players compete on.

Methodology We fuse science and art to create a fact-based roadmap for each individual. We use evidence, not opinion-based coaching to influence performance. Allied to that, our attention focuses in on skill development for each individual. We operate in a POD system where students work as individuals within an overarching program, which allows flexibility and individualization of the program.

GOLF DEVELOPMENT

Training Program

Following a periodized training schedule which morphs seamlessly through the phases of technical, blending, competitive, rest and refection training, we work on controlling the ball and acquiring the necessary skills to have the tools needed to play tournament golf at the highest level.

Benchmarking & Assessments Using an array of the latest technology at our disposal including Swing Catalyst 3D

Motion Plate & Studio, TrackMan, 3D Golf BioDynamics, BodiTrak, Video, Force Plates and SAM PuttLab - we research facts on the player's game. Only then can we create a fact-based roadmap based not on opinion, but on sound evidence and data.

Blueprints

Using the assessment data, an individualize improvement plan or blueprint is created for each student with clear and measurable process goals in all areas of training. Outcomes and goals are easy to set, but the blueprint provides the roadmap or the how to achieve those goals. Blueprints are regularly monitored and adjusted on progress and development.







Performance Studio Powered by Swing Catalyst

The most highly regarded piece of technology in golf when it comes to pressure plates, used by many of the world's best golfers, Swing Catalyst measures the ground force and where and how the pressure moves during the swing. Through changes in pressure levels, shifting pressure in different directions and timing, dramatic swing changes can be made that create highly efficient swings and substantial increases in distances.

K-Vest and 3D Motion Capture

K-MOTION Interactive is one of the first companies to introduce 3D motion capture within the golf industry. The 3D wearable wireless vest gives instant feedback to the player through sensors placed on the upper torso, pelvis, lead arm and lead wrist. Through the use of visual and audio cues, the player is directed into the correct position. The use of K-Motion will accelerate the player's improvements when used with experienced coaches who can fully utilize the drills and training programs in coaching.

VI Video

Industry leading video analysis software that allows coaches to analyze a golf swing from a number of different camera angles, in slow motion, making comparisons to Tour players and showcasing technical changes to the players.

TrackMan

A Doppler radar that tracks both the golf club and golf ball giving 28 different parameters. This is the world's most prominent tracker and is used by PGA and LPGA tour players. The rich data gathered by the TrackMan allows accurate information to be given, taking out any guess work. A high level of working knowledge is needed to fully utilize this piece of equipment.

BodiTrak

Brings comprehensive, real-time ground mechanics data & insight. The force pressure mat is designed to be portable for use on the practice range for full swing as well as putting, chipping and pitching. Information on how the center of pressure shifts in the swing gives experienced coaches the ability to make quick and sustainable swing fixes. Knowledge of how the pressure shifts during the swing allows a player to understand how to generate maximum power with their swing.

SAM PuttLab

The most recognizable putting system, it uses radar and lasers to give precise information, collecting data on things, such as: club path, face angle, tempo, ball spin and centeredness of strike. Through this rich data, SAM PuttLab then allows quick and factual changes to be made, when in the hands of a highly skilled coach.







TOURNAMENT + COMPETITION

An integral part of IJGA's golf training methodology is a strong focus on tournament competition. IJGA students spend weekends during the school year gaining valuable experience playing in nationally ranked events across the country. Students compete in many tournaments on the International Junior Golf Tour (IJGT) and Hurricane Junior Golf Tour (HJGT) as well as in American Junior Golf Association (AJGA) and other marquee junior golf events. All IJGT events are nationally ranked by Golfweek and Junior Golf Scoreboard. With over 40 hosted events, IJGT provides an excellent platform for juniors to increase their tournament results and acquire the recognition that college coaches will notice.

With IJGA's partnership with Sir Nick Faldo and Faldo Series, IJGA students now have the opportunity to play in Faldo Series America. The winner of the U.S. Grand Final qualifies for Faldo Series Asian Grand Final.

FALDO SERIES/PARTNERSHIP IJGA and IJGT partner with Faldo Series

IJGA student-athletes benefit from IJGA's relationship with Sir Nick Faldo and his global junior development effort, Faldo Series, which hosts events in Europe, Asia, Australia, New Zealand and South America. Starting in 2017, Faldo Series now partners with IJGA and IJGT to bring opportunities for junior golfers in the United States to compete in the Faldo Series. IJGA organizes opportunities for junior golfers to compete in a series of first-class tournaments on some of the most prestigious golf courses in the world.





MENTAL PERFORMANCE **PROGRAM**

The goals of the program are to:

- Improve performance
- Build character and self leadership
- Improve mental skills
- Create more consistency
- Have a lot more fun

Mental Performance Training is a critical element of junior golf development, to help players adopt a growth mindset, understand adaptability, and develop resilience to apply not only in golf but in life. The program is individualized to help student athletes identify their areas of challenge and provide a clear path for improvement within the overall blueprint of development.

This program is explored in the classroom, applied on the golf course, and individualized through sessions and direct student reflection, and feedback, from competition. The program also works closely with the IJGA Character Program to provide an inspiring environment where students learn to become their best.

Classroom Curriculum

The classroom exposes students to different topics in applied sport psychology and the psychology of performance. The information from these classes promotes increases in self-awareness and serve to develop a working competence of knowledge that is beneficial not only in golf, but also in their academic and personal pursuits.

On-Course Individual


As a complement to the classroom curriculum, a member of the mental performance team works on the range and/or course during training to build on each student's individualized mental plan and practices and provide support in the training environment.

Tournament Experience

Understanding how each student prepares and responds during competition is a critical component of reaching peak performance. Observing students during competitive rounds allows the coaches to evaluate progress under tournament conditions with the key emphasis in improving scores by understanding which key foundational skills require development based on facts and evidence.

Accountability is emphasized as we ask each student to objectively evaluate their preparation and performance following each tournament. This feedback then processed and measured to further individualize each students' plan for development. Tournament Experience is the area that we feel is pinnacle to blending in facts and creating a plan from an objective understanding. This allows students to further develop their foundation of skills and build confidence through independence.





HERITAGE ACADEMY

Students benefit from flexible course scheduling classes are either in the morning or the afternoon so that students are able to dedicate the rest of the day to their sport. Even when on tournament, Heritage Academy supports students by using technology that allows them to follow their classes digitally. IJGA particularly appreciates the facility's support of the students' passion. The anxiety of falling behind in class is not conducive to good performance on the course.

Gloria Shoemaker, Head of School at Heritage Academy prides herself on a team of teachers who support the passions of students while challenging them academically. The credits and levels of instruction at Heritage Academy meet and exceed SCISA/AdvanceEd guidelines, university admissions criteria and NCAA eligibility standards. Despite balancing academics and golf, Heritage Academy students achieve 100% college placement including Yale, Princeton, Columbia and Michigan.

Heritage Academy has partnerships with a number of organizations including tennis, equestrian, and soccer academies. The mixture of different sports and the international blend of athletes makes for a vibrant environment in which students thrive and come to learn and appreciate other cultures. Although the students are all individuals, what brings them together and makes for a harmonious learning environment is the desire to excel and stand out in their field, and the willingness to work as hard as they can to achieve this goal. - · Heritage Academy has flexible course scheduling, running from 7:15 am to 5:00 pm, with 6 blocks of 90-minute classes, allowing students the option of AM school with PM golf, or which many prefer because of the benefits, AM golf and PM school.
- Students are able to select any three classes for 3 credits per semester or are able to select two classes with one online class to make up their 3 credits. Over the year students will typically earn 6 credits, but by doing only three classes per semester the amount of revision time or catch-up time from travelling is minimized from the 6 classes students regularly take in other schools.

HILTON HEAD PREPARATORY SCHOOL

- Now in its 50th year, Hilton Head Prep has served their community well with an outstanding team of educators, rigorous college-prep curriculum and as a traditional high school, an extensive array of athletic teams, performing and visual arts.
- HHP classes start at 7:15 am and run through to 1:30 pm, with students typically attending seven 45-minute classes, one of which is an elective.
- Over the course of the Fall and Spring semesters the students earn 6 credits, the same annual credit requirement of Heritage Academy.

COLLEGE PLACEMENT

IJGA has an experienced team to assist each student to find their RIGHT fit college to achieve their golf and academic goals. After creating a college list, a roadmap is created for the students' test prep and college application strategy. Together with the Golf Coaches, IJGA merges the college list and helps the students seek a scholarship to play college golf at their RIGHT fit school.

- IJGA'S College Planning and Placement Team will guide students through the entire college recruiting and placement process.
- Whether students aspire to play NCAA Division I, II, III or NAIA golf, IJGA will prepare and equip players for the school of their dreams.

PLANNING IS THE FIRST AND MOST IMPORTANT STEP IN COLLEGE PLACEMENT.

Boasting a near 100% college placement rate, the IJGA approach to college preparation has proven effective time and time again. Students have received over \$52 million in scholarships and IJGA alumni have gone to attend schools with prestigious golf programs, such as: Georgia Tech, Princeton, Dartmouth, Oklahoma State University, Texas A&M, Notre Dame, Yale, University of Alabama, UCLA and Boston College. Ultimately, IJGA students have gone on to have successful careers in the PGA, LPGA, and European Tours, with some alumni reaching the ranks of famous golfers.

IJGA's College Planning & Placement works with student-athletes and families to create an individualized roadmap for reaching their goals of studying and playing golf at the collegiate level. This work begins when a student enters high school (grade 9) and incorporates families, coaches and both university admissions and athletic staff in their efforts.

- IJGA develops a clear, long-term game plan for the recruiting process including financial aid, academic testing and admissions.
- · IJGA builds a golf and academic resume.
- IJGA shares what college coaches are looking for and how they recruit.
- IJGA assists with understanding the NCAA & NAIA eligibility centers.


IJGA FUEL



International students attending boarding school at IJGA will be issued an I-20 through Heritage Academy or Hilton Head Preparatory once the deposit and tuition are paid.

The Heritage English Language Academy provides English as a Second Language (ESL) instruction to non-native speakers in grades 7-12 and through a specialized program for high school graduates. The goal of the Academy is to advance all ESL students to a level of academic and language proficiency so that they can function independently in the mainstream college preparatory classroom setting, or for Post-Graduate students to enter a college curriculum. A South Carolina standards-based curriculum is taught in English.

International Post-Graduate students usually attend IJGA on a tourist visa that is obtained through your country's embassy. International Post-Graduate students who are issued an I-20 must be registered full-time with the University of South Carolina Beaufort.
